How the Gas Stove Works in the NYCC Kitchen

There have been some questions surrounding the smell of gas coming from the kitchen. Yes, smelling gas is not a good thing, but that does not mean that there is an issue when it comes to our gas range in the church kitchen. There are 8 pilot lights associated with our range. 3 on top of the range, 3 under the grill and one in each of the two ovens under the metal plates (covers) at the bottom. The first thing you look for when you smell gas is is there a pilot light out. The most obvious place to look first is under the grill because they are the closest to the front and go out the most. All that needs to be done is to take the lighter and re-light the pilot that had gone out. There is not enough gas being expelled when a pilot light goes out to cause an explosion, so a pilot light can be easily and safely relit. Does the author of this article really want to be anywhere near a lit flame or gas at any time? Not really! I don't like gas, never will, and would rather be down the road and would rather be down the road when the pilot lights are being re-lit. But Mark took me on a tour and did a training session. Re-lighting a pilot is doable. Having said all of this, if you have questions please seek out Mark if you have any questions.
