Springs of Living Water

In my back yard I have heavy clay soil that retains moisture. There have been whole summers when I have not mowed a dry lawn. After our wet spring I thought this year would be one of them. But we are experiencing one of the driest Augusts on record.

Here is a picture of my yard. Notice how brown it is! The grass there is dormant. Except for that swath on the center right where it is still green and flourishing. That same area is where the snow melts first in winter. Dig down a bit and you'll find water. You see, there is a natural spring that comes close to the surface.

Water is essential for life and for flourishing. (Yes, of course, because you need water to make coffee!)

The Psalmist said, "With you is the fountain of life" (Ps. 36:9)

The prophet wrote, God's people "will not hunger or thirst, neither scorching wind nor sun will strike them; for the One who has compassion on them will lead them, and by springs of water will guide them." (Isaiah 48:10)

Jesus said, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (John 4:13-14)

And John saw in his vision, "The Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their Shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water." (Revelation 7:17)

Notice a theme: No matter how bleak things may seem, or how dry our spirits may be, God consistently offers springs of living water. Jesus came that we might have life and "to have it abundantly." God desires for us to not just survive but to flourish.
