From the road

I ended up going to church twice on Sunday. The first time was virtual church be in the Internet. Then our group went to the Johnny Cash Museum in downtown Nashville. Cash has been raised in church but rebelled and spent many years in the grip of self substance abuse. Later, he gave his life to Christ, and was freed from his addiction. He boldly witnessed to the grace of God. The Man in Black even wrote a biographical novel about the Apostle Paul—The Man in White.

After that, I went to the "Mother Church" of country music – Ryman auditorium. I learned that it had originally been built as a church. Here is the story: in the 1800s Nashville was a wild town. The Reverend Sam Jones decided to try to clean it up. A wealthy river boat owner, Thomas Ryman, took exception. But when he went to one of Reverend Jones's services, he gave his life to Christ. Ryman then decided to build an auditorium for revival services. After Ryman died in 1904 the auditorium was named in his honor.

Over the years, the Ryan auditorium hosted many notable speakers, concerts, and other events. Eventually, the grand old Opry moved its radio program to the Ryman. Since then it has become known as the "mother church" of country music.

Country music still has a strong connection to its Christian roots. Many artists still witness to their faith and to God's grace.
