From the Desk of Rev. Cynthia Biggar

Last evening, more than 20 people gathered in the Fellowship Hall for a Shrove Tuesday pancake supper. Many thanks to Amanda Skupin, the Faith Formation team, the Davis family, and others for making this such a successful event! Before we ate, and before I said the Blessing, Amanda gave a great explanation of what Shrove Tuesday means, and why we were eating pancakes. “Shrove” is the past tense of the verb “shrive,” which relates to being forgiven for sins following confession (which many of us do by confessing to God when we are so inclined). In earlier times in Christendom, there was a three-day “Shrovetide” to prepare for the contemplative, penitential season of Lent. It was customary during Shrovetide to use up fats and sweets before embarking on a Lenten fast; hence a pancake supper, even if we are not planning to fast during Lent.

There is no reason why we cannot find our own meaning in such customs, especially with a bit of humor involved (the way Shrove Tuesday is celebrated in New Orleans—Mardi Gras—“Fat Tuesday.”) Several participants last evening were wearing pajamas as we had been invited to do, Mardi Gras masks were available, and “dessert” was a King Cake such as one would find in New Orleans on Mardi Gras—with a surprise baked into it (a mini baby doll). As your new Interim Pastor I was happy that several children came with their families last evening, and they appeared to be having fun.

Today we will be offering a traditional Ash Wednesday service at 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall, along with members of the Gray UCC church. Their pastor, the Rev. Lindy Howe, will be leading the service with me, and those who wish to do so will be invited to come forward to receive ashes marking the sign of the cross on your hand or your forehead. Last evening, Amanda burned the palm leaves from last year’s Palm Sunday service, safely, outside, while we were eating, and the ashes will be used this evening.

Lent, which starts on Ash Wednesday, is a season that invites us intentionally to grow closer to God. (The word “Lent” relates etymologically to the “Lengthen,” and refers to the lengthening days this time of year).

On the First Sunday in Lent, this coming Sunday, we will embark upon a worship series called “The Way” (prepared by Dr. Marcia McFee; published online by Worship Design Studio). I have used their material in the past, and have been informed that Rev. Nancy White did likewise here at North Yarmouth. “The Way” was inspired in part by the 2010 film “The Way,” produced and written by Emilio Estevez. The film involves a walk along the Camino de Santiago, a traditional pilgrimage route in France, Portugal and Spain; and the themes of forgiveness and reconciliation. The Faith Formation team is planning to organize a Family Night sometime in March, to share another meal and enjoy “The Way” movie together (details to be determined).

I look forward to walking the Lenten journey with you this year!
